ABOUT THE FOREST

The Forest of Reading® is Canada's largest recreational reading program! This initiative of the Ontario Library Association (OLA) offers **eight reading programs** to encourage a love of reading in people of all ages. The Forest helps celebrate Canadian books, publishers, authors and illustrators.

More than **270,000 readers** participate annually from their School and/or Public Library. All Ontarians/Canadians are invited to participate via their local public library, school library, or individually. The program aims to:

- Create a meaningful experience for your readers and create exciting opportunities for reluctant readers to create lifelong readers.
- A proven head start: Children who read for fun have higher literacy scores, have more success in science and math, and are more socially and civically engaged (Reading for Joy, P4E, 2011).
- With fun activities, prizes and more, the Forest of Reading puts libraries at the heart of the action!
- Help support and celebrate Canadian books, publishers, authors and illustrators by taking advantage of the Forest's curated, all-Canadian reading lists for all ages and levels.



The program is growing each year, with 29% of registrations in 2017 running it for the first time. The Forest of Reading is a dynamic and exciting experience for any writer.

Over 1,000 titles are submitted to the Forest of Reading program each year. Publisher and author/illustrator involvement is so integral to the success of the Forest programs.

Being nominated for a Forest of Reading award is a privilege that many Canadian authors and illustrators welcome. Once a title is nominated, book sales can increase by the thousands.

The Forest represents over 20 years of the best in Canadian literature. Year after year, young voters in the Forest of Reading program have recognized nationally celebrated authors, including: Eric Walters, Kenneth Oppel, Susan Nielsen, Marsha Skrypuch, Kevin Sylvester, David Skuy, Helaine Becker, and Caroline Pignat.



FESTIVAL OF TREES

A rock concert of reading for young readers

The Festival of Trees is the annual celebration of the Forest of Reading that brings together young readers, authors, illustrators, teachers, library staff and parents.

It is the largest children's literature festival in Canada and attracts attendees from dozens of school boards, public libraries and communities around Ontario. The days are packed with fun and engaging activities, including award ceremonies, author/illustrator workshops, roving entertainments, games, and giveaways. The Festival is growing and has tripled its attendance since its inception in 2007.

Due to demand, the Toronto Festival was expanded into a three-day event, with one day focusing exclusively on French-Canadian authors and programming.


