## **OLBA Regional Councillor**

The Regional Councillor position is a 3-year commitment to the OLBA. Time commitment is **on average, 15 hours per month** spent on other activities/events/responsibilities. Availability across flexible days/hours inclusive of evenings and weekends. **You must be a current library board member in order to be appointed.** 

## **Regional Councillor Role:**

- 1. Support the OLA and OLBA's mission, vision, and values.
  - Be prepared for meetings and familiar with OLA policies and position statements
  - Encouraged to write articles for Inside OLBA and Open Shelf
  - Be proactive and positive in effecting change.
- 2. Liaise with OLBA members in their region.
  - Contact each board in your region annually, by phone or email.
- 3. Attend activities and events sponsored by the OLBA whenever possible.
  - Attend OLA Super Conference if possible (currently virtual).
  - Attend Saturday OLBA meetings (Minimum 4 per year, currently virtual, travel costs are covered by OLA).
  - The OLBA and OLA AGMs, if possible.
  - Help with training events.
- 4. Fiduciary duties to the OLBA.
  - Advocate in the best interest of Ontario Public Library Board members.
- 5. Participate in our relationship with stakeholders:
  - When possible attend OLS, FOPL Board Assembly meetings etc.

## Knowledge and Skills

- Demonstrated knowledge of Equity & Inclusion, Anti-oppressive practice and Anti-Black racism.
- Demonstrated ability to work effectively with people from a diversity of backgrounds.
- Problem assessment and solving abilities
- Flexible in working with changing priorities.
- Ability to work both independently and as a part of a larger team.
- Strong oral and written communication and presentation skills.

We expect all OLBA Council members to be respectful, collaborative, and dedicated.
