The OCULA Award for Special Achievement honours exceptional achievement(s) in at least one of the following areas:

- a) Service to library committees, associations or organizations that demonstrates great impact, collaboration, and mentorship
- b) Research and publication in areas of academic librarianship, especially research projects that show innovation, impact, and have been disseminated widely
- c) Planning and implementing a library program (e.g. innovative approaches to teaching, reference services, or community engagement) which demonstrates impact, collaboration, and longevity

The OCULA Award for Special Achievement will not be awarded if there are no nominations or if nominations do not meet the selection criteria.

Use the criteria below to evaluate nominations and the information submitted for the OCULA Special Achievement Award.

- 1. Each committee member scores alone and then they confer
- 2. Grant points for each level (Novice, Proficient, Exceptional) for each criterion
