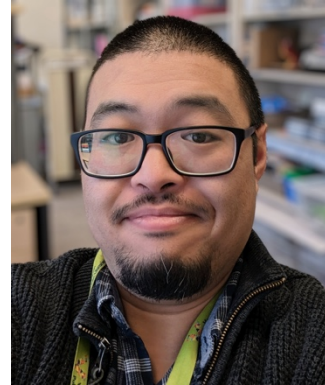


Candidate 5:
