Through this investment – an additional \$3.75 million over 3 years – nearly 40 public libraries on reserve will be significantly assisted in continuing to perform their unique role: preserving their communities' collective memory, revitalizing First Nations languages, assisting community members in preparing for job skills and entrepreneurship, and providing a place to nurture important social connections.
